Curriculum

St. Brigid's Primary School provides a broad and balanced curriculum for all children so that they experience success in their learning and achieve high standards. Our school's curriculum secures opportunities for each child to engage in active learning. In each of the key areas of the curriculum (Language & Literacy, Mathematics and Numeracy, Information Communication Technology, The World Around Us, Physical Development , The Arts, Personal Development and Religion) our pupils develop the knowledge, understanding and skills they need in ways that suit their individual ability.

Personal & Social Development

St. Brigid's places a high priority on children's happy transition from their home, nursery or playgroup to the school. Our P1 teacher visits the children in their pre-school setting.

The school has played a leading role in promoting pupils' Personal Development & Mutual Understanding [PDMU], an important element of the Revised Primary Curriculum. Children in Years 1 - 7 participate in structured, weekly Circle Time lessons allowing every child in the lesson the opportunity to meet in a circle to speak , listen, and interact with each other.

Mutual Understanding is also promoted through links with schools locally, nationally and internationally.

Parental Partnership

St. Brigid's values the role you play in the development and education of your child. We work in close partnership with parents. This partnership begins before your child even starts school. An Induction Meeting will help you become familiar with the curriculum the pupils follow, how you can assist your child's learning and the procedures and routines of the school. After your child has settled in the school a meeting will be organised to discuss how well they are progressing. Parents will also have an opportunity to meet their child's teacher to discuss academic progress and a written report will provide an overview of your child's achievement in P1. Opportunities also exist throughout the year to informally discuss matters that arise or concerns you may have.

Many of the parents are also involved in the school's active and committed Parent Teacher Association [PTA]. It is an opportunity to meet other parents and to support the school.

Learning Support Centres

St. Brigid's has two Learning Support Centres. Class A for P1- 4 pupils and Class B for P5 - 7 pupils. Both classes provide a secure, stimulating and supportive learning environment for children who require specialist assistance. Both classes are very much part of our school community and add much to the life and spirit of our school.

Outdoor Play

St. Brigid's staff believe that the outdoors can provide young children with one of the best possible environments in which to learn. Children in the Foundation Stage have access to a stimulating, richly resourced separate playground in which to play daily. The outdoor 'classroom' offers children the opportunity to use effective modes of learning—play, movement and sensory experience. The design and layout of the new playground has been planned to complement and extend the learning that takes place in the classroom . We have a newly constructed canopy sheltering picnic tables, where children enjoy a variety of table top activities and creative play. In the summer term children also enjoy snack times in the outdoors.

Healthy Eating & Positive Playtime

St. Brigid's is a Healthy Eating School. Pupils drink either milk or water at breaktime and enjoy a snack of fruit or toast. The school places a high importance on play and has led the way in developing active playgrounds, recognised by the NEELB's Innovation & Good Practice programme. The Primary 1 children share the Foundation Stage Playground with Primary 2 and under the supervision of experienced and caring staff at lunchtime they enjoy a range of fun activities.
