







Think about a design for your marble run before you start building.

Make sure your marble run starts high above the ground.

You can use a big piece of cardboard or you can use a clear wall in your home ⓒ Will it zig-zag back and forth?

Do you want to include any flat or even uphill sections?


Think about whether you want to use the whole tubes or cut them in half.

Make it colourful Whole tube



Start building your track. Using your cardboard tubes, assemble your track according to your plan. Tape the first cardboard tube to your big piece of cardboard or a wall with a long strip of tape.

Place your second tube next to the first one, and so on. Don't build it all yet. Build a small part and then stop to test it.





If your marble didn't make it to the end, try to figure out WHY.

Is there a spot in your track where the marble got stuck? Was the marble going too slow to make it over a hill?

If necessary, make changes to your design, like adjusting the angles of your tubes or improving the tube connections.



If the marble made it the whole way to the end, try to add more parts to your track, or build alternative routes by connecting more cardboard tubes. ENJOY
